The historic Fortress of Louisbourg is located in Cape Breton, Nova Scotia. Built by the French between 1720 and 1740, it was used for both business and military purposes. In 1758, it was taken over by the British, at which time the French lost control of Atlantic Canada . Today, the Fortress of Louisbourg remains open as a living museum from May to October, and offers visitors a unique glimpse into the daily the lives of early French Canadian settlers in Nova Scotia. **Info HERE**
